

# Program Highlights





### **Behavioral Health Services**

Glenkirk's Behavioral Health Services Division encompasses the Life Balance Services array of therapeutic, behavioral and counseling services, and the Behavioral Health Clinic program services, which include counseling, medication management, community support services and daily living in-home services.



#### Life Balance Services (LBS)

Throughout 2024, Glenkirk's Life Balance Services (LBS) department made significant strides in expanding its impact by strengthening both its workforce and service offerings. The department welcomed three master's-level interns, providing hands-on clinical training to the next generation of behavioral health professionals. Beyond workforce expansion, LBS also introduced art, music, and dance-movement therapy groups.

In November, renowned expert Dr. John M. Guercio, PhD, BCBA-D, NADD-CC, LBA, led a specialized training for Glenkirk BCBAs and

colleagues from other agencies. The session focused on Assessment of Adult Core Competencies (ACCEA) skills-building assessments to strengthen clinical expertise and better support adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities who face severe behavioral challenges. This was also Glenkirk's first training under its new Approved Continuing Education (ACE) certification, marking a key step in advancing professional development. The LBS team provided over 32,517 hours of service.

#### Behavioral Health Clinic (BHC)

Glenkirk's Behavioral Health Clinic experienced impressive growth in 2024, enrolling 151 individuals and welcoming 23 new clients from the broader community.

Over the course of the year, the clinic provided more than 5,800 hours of behavioral health services. In addition



to direct care, the BHC team took part in several outreach events, helping families and professionals learn about Glenkirk's therapy options. The clinic also formed partnerships with two local agencies, Avenues to Independence and Riverside Foundation, expanding its reach and bringing essential services to individuals who may not have had access otherwise.

### Clinical Services

Glenkirk's Clinical Services include an array of services including nursing care, medical care, care coordination services, respite, and intake.



At Glenkirk, the Clinical Services Division plays a key role in supporting the health, safety, and well-being of the people we serve. It works closely with our residential programs to make sure every individual receives the care and attention they need.

In 2024, **Medical Services** focused on keeping participants and staff healthy. Over the course of the year, the team coordinated 3,251 medical appointments, ensuring timely access to essential care across all homes and programs. They also organized flu shot, RSV, and COVID-19 booster

clinics, providing over 200 vaccines. The nursing team earned positive feedback during the annual Rule 116 licensing review and led a Hoyer Lift

Competency Training to reinforce safe transfer practices across residential settings. Together, these efforts reflect Glenkirk's commitment to delivering compassionate, coordinated care within our homes and throughout the wider community.

The Intake Department helped new families join the Glenkirk community. Staff processed 133 referrals, conducted 33 Meet & Greet interviews, gave 14 tours,

andhosted three dinner visits. A highlight of the year was hosting Glenkirk's first in-person Open House since the pandemic, giving families the chance to meet staff and learn more about our programs.

**Respite Services** provided much-needed relief for families caring for loved ones at home. Early in the year, the program supported 64 individuals. With the help of an additional \$281,000 in state funding, Glenkirk served 66 individuals by the fourth quarter. To make things easier for families, the team launched a new family web portal, streamlining the timesheet submission process.

### Day & Employment Services

Glenkirk's day programs offer a broad range of at-home, site-based, virtual and community-based activities. Glenkirk Employment Services offer an array of supports to adults seeking employment including group and individual employment opportunities.

Throughout the year, participants engaged in a wide range of meaningful activities, from therapeutic horseback riding and Zumba classes to cultural outings at the Chicago Symphony Orchestra. The Summer Experience program offered even more chances to learn, explore, and give back, with day trips to Lake Geneva, Great America, and the Brookfield Zoo, as well as volunteer projects at Bernie's Book Bank. By year's end, participants gathered for holiday celebrations and seasonal outings that fostered friendships, joy, and a deep sense of belonging.

During the summer, the division underwent an organizational restructure as we separated our Day and Residential Direct Support Professional (DSP) Roster. For the first time since the pandemic, the team had a dedicated staff roster focused solely on Day Services, strengthening its ability to deliver person-centered programming and meet the evolving needs of participants.

Glenkirk was also proud to be one of just four agencies selected for a technical assistance grant through the National Employment Opportunities Network (NEON), which provided staff trainings and program assessments to help expand employment pathways and promote greater independence. The Supported Employment program helped 18 individuals maintain community employment with six individuals working in competitive, fully-integrated jobs and twelve in group employment settings. The average wage was \$14.80/hr.

### Residential Services

Glenkirk's Residential Services offer individuals an array of supports to live in the community as independently as possible. Services take place in a variety of residential settings - from the family home to small, group living arrangements to semi-independent settings.

Glenkirk's independent living, host-family, and group home residential offerings supported 125 individuals in 2024 across 23 attractive, community-based homes throughout Chicago's northern suburbs and North Shore communities. Through community living, residents build independence in self-care and daily living skills, form meaningful relationships, and engage fully in their communities.

In 2024, Glenkirk's Residential Services department completed significant renovations at its Community Integrated Living Arrangements (CILAs) in Mundelein, Wheeling, and Libertyville, enhancing accessibility



and updating amenities to improve comfort, safety, and overall quality of life for current residents. Additionally, five new residents moved into Glenkirk CILAs during the year.

After several years of staffing challenges, 2024 marked a turning point for the Residential Division, with significant strides in hiring Direct Support Professionals (DSPs). These highly trained and certified professionals are central to Glenkirk's mission and help provide the compassionate, high-quality support individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities need to thrive.

As Glenkirk continues rebuilding and growing its DSP team, the organization is strengthening the care it provides today while building for the future. This progress brings Glenkirk closer to its long-term vision: to open more homes, reach more communities, and ensure that every person who needs support has a safe, welcoming place to live.







### Charlie's Champions

Each year, Glenkirk's Charlie's Champions employee appreciation program recognizes Direct Support Professionals who have gone above and beyond to deliver quality care. Made possible by the Newcomb family's generosity, this program honors individual employees monthly and two Employees of the Year!

This new facility will allow us to deliver services more effectively, foster collaboration among staff and families, and create a warm, inclusive environment that reflects Glenkirk's mission and values.


With \$1.5 million secured from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO), we are well positioned to reach our full \$2.5 million campaign target. We now look to our community to help bring this vision to life.

In 2024, our community stepped up in a big way:


