



Position: Qualified Intellectual Disability Professional (QIDP)

FUNCTION

QIDPs ensure quality of services for assigned individuals through continuous monitoring and supervision. They are responsible for the following duties:

- Development, coordination and consistent implementation of Individual Service Plans (ISPs) through the interdisciplinary process for all assigned individuals
- Provide guidance and direction to direct care staff to ensure quality services are being provided to all individuals
- Act as a liaison between the Day and Residential program
- Perform other duties as assigned

POSITION REQUIREMENTS:

- Must be able to provide accredited U.S educational documents at a minimum of A BA/BS in the social service/human service or educational field is required.
- Must have a minimum of one year of experience working with individuals with intellectual disabilities is required.
- A working knowledge of DHS Rule 119, CARF regulations and the service plan process is preferred.
- Have a valid Illinois driver's license, meet and maintain driver eligibility per agency's insurance standards.
- Able to be trained in and implement all modules of Non-violent Crisis Prevention Intervention Training (CPI).
- Able to lift a minimum of 40 pounds to assist individuals with production.
- Able to physically assist individuals as needed for ambulating, transferring and/or evacuation in regards to individual self-preservation.
- Personal vehicle which is insured (proof of insurance required).
